This matter having come before the Court on the petition of the Washington State Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) for an Order Pendente Lite RE: Second Point of Diversion for claim no. 2109, the Court having heard from all the parties and being fully advised;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED:

1. The Claimant WDFW under claim no. 2109 shall have a right to add a second point of diversion, which shall be located as follows: 1600 feet west and 800 feet north of SE corner of Section 3 within the SW ¼ of the SE ¼ of section 3, Township 14 North, Range 16 West,


1 W.M. Parcel number 1614031-1001. This second point of diversion is illustrated on that
2 attached map.

3 2. This second point of diversion shall only be used when the initial point of diversion
4 can no longer satisfy the Claimant's ability to withdraw water from Oak Creek during the
5 period April 1 through October 31.

6 3. This authority to use a temporary second point of diversion shall expire when the
7 Department of Ecology issues its decision.


8 4. This approval does not set a precedent for any change requests in the future or bind the

10 second point of diversion on a permanent basis.


