Water would be pumped from the Columbia River and discharged into CID's existing canal system. Approximately 400 hp will be required. Intake pipe would extend into river from pump station located on riverbank. Passive stainless steel screens would be installed on intake pipe. Water would be discharged into existing CID canal system for conveyance to lands without water rights adjacent to, or in close proximity, to the canals. Water may also be used to replace water withdrawn upstream to serve lands adjacent to canal without water rights.

The Columbia Irrigation District ("CID") delivers water to its ratepayers from two sets of water rights. All CID water is currently taken from the Yakima River and both sets of water rights have been the subject of the Acquavella Adjudication of the Yakima River drainage pending in Yakima County Superior Court.

The CID is the water right holder of Court Claim Nos. 0977 and 03233(A). These two rights are the subject of the Court's Conditional Final Order entered February 12, 2004. A copy of that Order is attached as Exhibit "A".

The CID also delivers water under Water Right Claim No. 00358 as described in Report of Referee RE: Subbasin No. 31 and confirmed by the Court's Conditional Final Order entered November 4, 1993. A copy of the water right description in the Report of Referee and the Conditional Final Order are attached as Exhibit "B".

15 THIS MATTER has come on regularly before the Court with
16 Columbia Irrigation District having had its evidentiary
17 hearing on April 3 through 7, 1995. The Court filed its
18 Report of the Court Concerning the Water Rights for Columbia
19 Irrigation District, Volume 54, on October 8, 2003.

20 The United States filed an exception to the Report
21 concerning the quantity of water awarded to Columbia
22 Irrigation District. Ecology responded to and joined the
23 exception of the United States. The Kennewick Irrigation
24 District also responded to the exception filed by United
25 States. The parties resolved their respective exceptions and
26 responses, and stipulated to the water rights of the Columbia
27 Irrigation District as set forth in the Report of the Court
28 Concerning the Water Rights for the Columbia Irrigation
District, Volume 54. The Court accepted the Stipulation and
entered the Order Approving Stipulation to Withdraw United
States' Exception to Report of the Court Concerning the Water

1 Rights for the Columbia Irrigation District on February 12,
2 2004.

3 The Court, after reviewing the exception and other
4 materials filed, and after having heard argument and being
5 fully advised, hereby enters this Conditional Final Order
6 based upon its Report of the Court Concerning the Water
7 Rights of the Columbia Irrigation District, Volume 54. This
8 Conditional Final Order will ultimately be incorporated into
9 a final decree that determines and integrates all of the
10 rights of the parties in this adjudication, at which time it
11 shall be forwarded to the Director of the Department of
12 Ecology for issuance of Certificates of Adjudicated Water
13 Right.

14 Based on the foregoing, IT IS:

15 ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the final decree
16 shall include the following in regard to Columbia Irrigation
17 District, Court Claim No. 0977 and No. 03233(A):

- 18 1. The source of water is the Yakima River.
- 19 2. The priority date is August 6, 1891.
- 20 3. The point of diversion is at Horn Rapids Dam located
21 approximately 1780 feet north and 2570 feet west from the
22 southeast corner of Section 3, being within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of
23 Section 3, T. 10 N., R. 27 E.W.M.
- 24 4. The quantities confirmed are 145 cfs and 60,398 acre-
25 feet per year.
- 26 5. The purpose of use is irrigation of 9,574 acres within
27 its 10,868 acre service area.
- 28 6. The season of use is March 20 through October 15.

1 7. The place of use boundary is shown on CID 3 (map) and
2 as described on CID 2 (written).

3 8. Pursuant to the Order Approving Stipulation to Withdraw
4 United States' Exception to Report of the Court Concerning
5 the Water Rights for the Columbia Irrigation District dated
6 February 12, 2004:

7 The Columbia Irrigation District shall ensure accurate
8 measurement of the water that it delivers to the Baker
9 Boyer National Bank/City of West Richland, all entities
10 that encompass the Angus Ranch, and the Kennewick
11 Irrigation District. Order, pp. 1-2.

12 In accordance with RCW 90.03.240, Certificate of
13 Adjudicated Water Right shall be issued as quantified and
14 described above.

15 This Conditional Final Order, relating to the
16 confirmation of water rights to Columbia Irrigation District
17 constitutes a final order for purposes of appeal [see RAP
18 2.2(d)], except for purposes of final integration of all
19 confirmed rights as provided in Section XII of Pretrial Order
20 No. 8, procedures for Claim Evaluation, dated March 3, 1989,
21 of this Court.

Pursuant to the direction of the Court, the Referee then served a notice (together with a copy of the report) upon all parties setting a time period for filing any exceptions to the report and for the aforementioned hearing on exceptions.

On March 19, 1992, the Court held a hearing on exceptions to Report of Referee. The Court, after reviewing the exceptions and other materials filed, and after having heard argument and being fully advised, filed its Order on Exceptions: Subbasin No. 31 (Richland) on May 14, 1992, which, among other matters, ordered that the Referee schedule a remand hearing to further consider certain claims as specified in the Order.

III.

On March 31, 1993, the Court having heard recommendations from the Referee and having considered comments of counsel, Terry Miller for the Columbia Irrigation District, and counsel Floyd E. Ivey for the Kennawick Irrigation, filed an Order Transferring Columbia Irrigation District to Major Claimant Pathway, from the Subbasin Pathway (Subbasin 31), for the concluding activities of the Columbia Irrigation District water rights proof.

IV.

On April 8, 1993, the Referee filed Supplemental Report of Referee Re: Subbasin No. 31 (Richland) dated April 7 1993. Thereafter, this Court set August 12, 1993 for a hearing on exceptions to this report. Pursuant to the direction of the Court, the Referee then served a notice (together with a copy of the report) upon all parties setting a time period for filing any exceptions to the report and for the aforementioned hearing on exceptions.



V.

2 A hearing on the exceptions filed was held by the Court on
3 August 12, 1993. The first exception was filed against the
4 claim of Baker Boyer National Bank (Claim No. 0358) by Columbia
5 Irrigation District (CID), which expressed concern that since
6 one of the points of diversion for Baker Boyer's recommended
7 right was located at the Horn Rapids Dam, and since the CID had,
8 under contract, previously carried Baker Boyer water in the CID
9 canal, the right as recommended would obligate the CID to
10 continue transporting the Baker Boyer water in its canal without
11 a contract between the parties to do so. The Referee assured
12 the Court that it was not his intent, and suggested that
13 language could be incorporated by the Referee clarifying that
14 the confirmation of the diversions at Point of Diversion No. 1
15 would not require CID to transport water in its facilities
16 without a contract between the parties.

17 A second exception was filed by Chris and Ollie Stade
18 (Claim No. 00399). The Referee had made no recommendation to
19 confirm a right to the Stades because they did not appear at the
20 supplemental evidentiary hearing to present proof of their
21 claim. The Court allowed their exception, and Chris Stade,
22 appearing pro se, offered testimony and evidence regarding this
23 claim.

24 Based upon the statements of counsel, and testimony heard
25 and exhibits admitted at the August 12, 1993 hearing, the Court
26

1 Subbasin No. 31 (Richland)" filed with the Court on September 9,
 2 1993, except as to the claims of the Columbia Irrigation

 13 constitutes a final order for purposes of appeal (see RAP
 14 2.2(d)), except for purposes of final integration of all
 15 confirmed rights as provided in Section XII of Pretrial Order
 16 No. 8 (Procedures for Claim Evaluation, dated March 3, 1989) of
 17 this Court.

1 whatever rights may have related to the land in question had not been exercised for
2 well over the five consecutive years that RCW 90.14 provides for relinquishment of
3 the right. The attempt to irrigate this land by Mr. Reis in 1974 could not
4 "breathe new life" into a right which had relinquished for non-use two years
5 earlier.

6 Based upon the foregoing the Referee recommends that the earlier
7 recommendation to the Court in the Report of Referee, dated October 25, 1991, not
8 be altered and that this exception be denied.

10 COURT CLAIM NO. 00358 -- Baker Boyer National Bank
11 City of West Richland

12 Dennis E. Davin and Richard J. Allen submitted a Statement of Claim to the
13 Court for the use of waters from the Yakima River for irrigation. Neither of these
14 claimants appeared during the original evidentiary hearing; however, subsequent to
15 that hearing Baker Boyer National Bank was substituted as a claimant in this
16 proceeding and filed a motion with the Court to present evidence at the
17 supplemental hearing. Such motion was filed pursuant to Pretrial Order No. 9.
18 During the supplemental hearing, Baker Boyer National Bank was represented by
19 Robert L. Zagelow, attorney at law. Dennis Davin the original developer of the
20 property, and Hulette Johnson, an employee of Baker Boyer National Bank provided
21 testimony.

22 This claim is based upon three Certificates of Water Right issued by the State
23 of Washington. Surface Water Certificate No. 10504 issued for the diversion of
24 9.46 cfs; 1,892 acre-feet per year for the irrigation of 473 acres. Surface Water
25 Certificate No. 10505 issued for the appropriation of 0.24 cfs; 48 acre-feet per
26 year for the irrigation of 12 acres, and Surface Water Certificate No. S4-24027C

1 issued for the use of 0.60 cfs; 140 acre-feet per year for the irrigation of 27
2 acres. The priority dates for the certificates are June 28, 1967, February 7,
3 1968, and July 7, 1975 respectively. The source of water for all of these
4 certificates is the Yakima River, and the points of diversion for these three
5 certificates were identified as being within Government Lot 3 of Section 16, T.9
6 N., R. 28 E.W.M.

7 According to the record, this property was developed starting in 1967 by Mr.
8 Davin. The irrigation development was a relatively diversified agricultural
9 operation with potatoes, wheat and alfalfa. Later, the property was utilized for
10 the production of sod (turf grass). The land presently is in the process of being
11 transferred to the City of West Richland to be ultimately used for future
12 residential development.

13 When this project was initially conceived, a pumping station was constructed
14 on the Yakima River within Government Lot 3, Section 16, T. 9 N., R. 28 E.W.M.
15 From this point water was pumped into a stilling basin and then repumped by means
16 of a bank of 200 horsepower pumps and distributed to the land being irrigated. The
17 developers experienced some problems with a pumping station at the aforementioned
18 location, especially with respect to flooding damage and ice jams and as a result
19 the developers contracted with the Columbia Irrigation District for that district
20 to convey water through the Horn Rapids Canal down to the bank of pumps that served
21 the Davin Development. The record does not disclose any authorization for this
22 change of point of diversion. This change, however, did not replace the original
23 point of diversion, but could be characterized as an added point of diversion since
24 the pumping station on the river in Section 16 was retained. Essentially the
25 Referee views the use of the Columbia Irrigation District facilities as an

1 additional point of diversion under the three water right certificates and this
2 point of diversion is located at Horn Rapids Dam within Government Lot 6, Section
3 3, T. 10 N., R. 27 E.W.M.

4 Based upon the testimony and evidence presented the Referee is of the opinion
5 that water rights were perfected under the three aforementioned certificates and
6 the Referee further recommends that water rights be confirmed to this claimant
7 essentially as identified in the three aforementioned certificates. The only
8 change that the Referee will recommend is the addition of a second point of
9 diversion located at the Columbia Irrigation District intake facility.

10 Upon confirmation of the rights herein proposed it is recommended that the
11 Director of the Department of Ecology cancel, rescind or otherwise make null and
12 void Certificate of Surface Water Right Nos. 10504, 10505, and S4-24027C.

15 The exception filed by the Columbia Irrigation District identified several
16 areas in which the District asserted that the Referee had erred in his original
17 report to the Court. The specific areas identified by the District were a) that
18 the Referee had misconstrued the effect of limiting agreements, b) the Referee
19 misconstrued the effect a contract between the Columbia Irrigation District and the
20 Kennewick Irrigation District, c) that the deed to Highland Water Users did not
21 transfer any of the Columbia Irrigation District's water right to the Highland
22 Water Users, d) the Referee mischaracterized the water requirements for soil and
23 the canal system, e) water for fish screening facilities, and f) that the State of
24 Washington is estopped from reducing the Columbia Irrigation District's water
25 right.
