





Mrs. Frye:

This letter comprises our request for a two year extension of time to complete irrigation development and application of water for beneficial use under referenced permit.

To date, we have made the following efforts to complete this project.


1. 41 acres are irrigated and water applied for center pivot farming, in S1/2 SW 1/4 of section 18, T 6 N, R 26 EWM.
2. Negotiated water delivery agreement with Stimpson Lane, which is verbal at this point, with details and cost pending outcome of drawdown /Salmon issues.
3. In 1992 and 1994, we negotiated with farm tenants to operate and develop an irrigation distribution system. After a agreement was reached in 1992, the tenant's crop contracts (potatoes) were not granted as he had planned. Different tenant was involved in 1994, but he filed bankruptcy and negotiations were dropped. Development has been delayed, due to tentants lack of crop acreage contracts and financial problems of tenant.
4. Bergs and tenants have paid \$500 in cash expenses for feasibility efforts, plus own time, travel expenses, etc. for this development. Bergs presently have retained professional consultant firm, Columbia Appraisal & Real Estate Co. to assist in planning, designing, negotiating agreements, and completing irrigation development.

We believe the above described efforts comprise due dilligence for development progress, for your granting extension of time to complete development.

PROVISIONS

A suitable measuring device approved by the Department of Ecology shall be installed and maintained in accordance with WAC 508-64-020 through WAC 508-64-040 in such a manner that the diversion herein authorized can be isolated and measured.

This authorization to use public waters of the state is classified as a FAMILY FARM PERMIT in accordance with Chapter 90.66 RCW (Initiative Measure No. 59). This means the land being irrigated under this authorization shall comply with the following definition: Family Farm - a geographic area including not more than 2,000 acres of irrigated agricultural lands, whether contiguous or noncontiguous, the controlling interest in which is held by a person having a controlling interest in no more than 2,000 acres of irrigated agricultural lands in the State of Washington which are irrigated under water rights acquired after December 8, 1977. Furthermore, the land being irrigated under this authorization must continue to conform to the definition of a family farm.

This authorization is subject to Washington Department of Fisheries juvenile salmon screening criteria (pursuant to RCW 75.20.040) and/or Washington Department of Wildlife gamefish screening criteria.

A proof inspection will be conducted prior to final certificate issuance. The certificate will reflect the extent of the project perfected within the limitations of the permit; including source(s), system instantaneous capacity, beneficial use(s), annual quantity, acreage, home services designed, place of use, and satisfaction of provisions.

Withdrawal of water under this right may be limited or otherwise regulated in favor of senior rights.

As provided in WAC 173-563-050(1), the minimum average weekly flows set forth in this subsection are subject to a reduction of up to 25 percent during low flow years, except that in no case shall the outflow from Priest Rapids Dam be less than 36,000 cfs.

Use of water under this authorization shall be contingent upon the water right holder's utilization of up-to-date water conservation practices and maintenance of efficient water delivery systems consistent with established regulation requirements and facility capabilities.

Use of water under this authorization can be expected to be curtailed at least once in every 20 years.

The annual quantity herein allocated is a portion of the amount reserved by the adoption of the John Day/McNary Reservation. The priority date of this filing, as against other uses, is July 24, 1980.


