





Dear Cindy:

As you probably know, Mike Hanover and I were in town a few weeks ago and stopped by to see you. You were not available but we did speak to a gentleman in your office who said that there is a possibility that we may be granted the additional 100 gallon water right in the near future.

We are in the final stages of getting approval from the State Health people. The final stage involves getting our plans and specifications approved by the State. If we are likely to get the water right then we do not have to design an additional 4,500 gallon water tank into the system for equalizing storage. Our engineer is asking us if we should incorporate this design in order to submit for final approval.

If possible, it would be very helpful if we could receive some indication if this water right approval is forthcoming. Any information you could provide at this time would be much appreciated.



I just wanted to make contact with you regarding the status of our additional 100 GPM water rights for our manufactured home park. I realize that you are probably still swamped with requests but I just wanted to check the progress of our situation. As you may recall we already have a right to 100 GPM and we need an additional 100 GPM to finish building our park.

It has been about 18 months since we applied and I was hoping some progress has been made. I have been receiving information from the State regarding the water situation but we have complied with all aspects of the public notice requirements as well as the fact that our park is in a fairly remote area.

Can we expect an approval in the near future? Are any rights being approved at this time? I don't mean to be a pain in the rear but I look forward to hearing from you at your earliest convenience.


