

CONTINUED LEGAL DESCRIPTION FOR LOCATION OF DIVERSION/WITHDRAWAL

Approximately 1,780 feet South and 560 feet West of the Northwest corner of Section 10. Point of diversion is located on parcel number 62799, a portion of the William Powell DCL located in Section 10, Township, 5 North, Range 1 EWM.

CONTINUED LEGAL DESCRIPTION FOR PROPERTY ON WHICH WATER IS TO BE USED

That part of the east 1259.38 feet of the William Powell D.L.C in Sections 3 and 10, lying northerly of the Lewis River and southerly of State Highway 503 (1-S), LESS that part there of lying north of the south line of Sec. 3 and west of the east line of the Leach land; AND the west half of the Irijah J. Byars D.L. C, in Secs. 2 and 11; LESS beginning on the east right-of-way line of Niemi Road, which is 30 feet east of the southwest corner of said Section 2; thence south on the said east line of the Niemi Road 465 feet to its

PROVISIONS

This Certificate supersedes Surface Water Certificate No. 10778, issued on August 1, 1969, which authorized the diversion of water to supplement the water available through Surface Water Certificate No. 9190A. Together, Surface Water Certificate 9190A and 10778 authorized a total withdrawal of 290 acre-feet per year for the purpose of irrigation.

Surface Water Certificate 9190A was transferred to a groundwater withdrawal for the new purpose of Municipal Water Supply via an Order issued on December 1, 2005. To account for this transfer, the annual diversion allowed under Surface Water Right Certificate 10778 is reduced to 200 acre-feet per year.

All conditions and requirements contained in reports of examination or permits previously issued apply to this certificate unless specifically noted below.

The right to use of the water aforesaid hereby confirmed is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described, except as provided in RCW 90.03.380, 90.03.390, and 90.44.100.

This certificate of water right is specifically subject to relinquishment for non-use of water as provided in Chapter 90.14 RCW.



intersection with the north line of Old Lewis River Road (Old Secondary Highway 1-S); thence south 74°23' east 321.5 feet, thence north 25°10' west 239.1 feet; thence north 208.0 feet; thence west 105.0 feet; thence north 4°41' east 207.4 feet; thence north 9°58' east 179.0 feet; thence north 10°50' east 265 feet, more or less, to the south right-of-way line of the New Secondary State way No. 1-S (New Lewis River Road); thence westerly along said south line 205 feet, more or less, to the west right-of-way of the Niemi Road; thence south on the east line of the Niemi Road 516 feet to the point of beginning; AND LESS rights-of-way acquired by State of Washington for road purposes.

Provisions Continued

Water Use: Recording and retention of data by the water right holder is required to inform the water users about how much water is used, when the water is used and to assist users in efficient water management. An approved measuring device shall be installed and maintained for each withdrawal of the sources identified by this water right in accordance with the rule "Requirements for Measuring and Reporting Water Use," Chapter 173-173 WAC.

Water use data shall be recorded weekly. The maximum monthly rate of diversion/withdrawal and the monthly total volume shall be submitted to Ecology by January 31st of each calendar year.

Chapter 173-173 WAC describes the requirements for data accuracy, device installation and operation, and information reporting. It also allows a water user to petition Ecology for modifications to some of the requirements. Installation, operation and maintenance requirements are enclosed as a document entitled "Water Measurement Device Installation and Operation Requirements".

Department of Ecology personnel, upon presentation of proper credentials, shall have access at reasonable times, to the records of water use that are kept to meet the above conditions, and to inspect at reasonable times any measuring device used to meet the above conditions.

Water Storage: Under RCW 90.03.350, any person intending to construct a dam or controlling works for the storage of 10 acre-feet or more of water, shall before beginning said construction or modification, submit plans and specifications of the same to the Department and secure approval as to its safety.

The plans and specifications must be prepared by a properly-qualified, professional engineer registered in the State of Washington, and carry his/her signature and seal. They must be submitted in duplicate such that one copy may be retained by the Department when the other is approved and returned to the applicant.

Not special plans will be required unless those submitted are found to be incomplete.

Plans and specifications prepared by government agencies not bearing the seal and signature of a professional engineer are acceptable only if endorsed by the principal or responsible engineer of the agency.

A general outline of minimum design criteria is available from the Department upon request.

Diversion Structure: The intake shall be screened at all times in accordance with Department of Fish and Wildlife screening criteria.

In accordance with the recommendations of the Department of Fish and Wildlife, no dam shall be constructed in connection with this diversion.

This authorization shall in no way excuse the permittee from compliance with any applicable federal, state, or local statutes, ordinances, or regulations including those administered by other programs of the Department of Ecology.
