PROVISIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The water requirement for irrigation in this climatic region is approximately 24 inches or 2 acre-feet per acre annually, (which includes a 30% application loss).

For the 16 acres found feasible under this application, the annual amount that is required is 32 acre-feet.

This application may be approved for 0.20 cubic feet per second from May 1 to October 1 and 32 acre-feet annually for irrigation of 16 acres.

Surface Water Certificate No. 509 is also appurtenant to this property and applicant has a pending application to change this certificate to irrigation usage. Therefore, this application will "Issue as a totally supplemental supply to existing rights. The total annual quantity appropriated under this application and all existing rights shall not exceed 32 acre-feet per year."

In accordance with the recommendations of the Departments of Fisheries and Game, the permit shall be issued subject to the following provisions: Diversion intake shall be tightly screened at all times with wire mesh having openings with dimensions not greater than 0.125 (1/8) inch.


It is noted that the point of diversion and/or water transmission facilities are not wholly located upon the land owned by the applicant. Applicant is, accordingly, advised that the issuance of permit by this Department for appropriation of the waters in question does not convey a right of access to, or other right to use, land which the applicant does not legally possess. Obtainment of such right is a private matter between applicant and owner of that land.

The Water Resources Act of 1971 specifies certain criteria regarding utilization and management of the waters of the State in the best public interest. Favorable consideration of this application has been based on sufficient waters available, at least during portions of the year. However, it is pointed out to the applicant that his use of the water may be subject to regulation at certain times, based on the necessity to maintain water quantities sufficient for preservation of the natural environment.

In accordance with Section 90.03.290 RCW I find that there is water available for appropriation from the source in question and that the diversion as recommended above will not impair existing rights or be detrimental to the public welfare. Therefore, permit should issue, subject to existing rights and indicated provisions.

Additionally, the permit when issued shall carry the following provision. "Nothing in this permit shall be construed as excusing the permittee from compliance with any applicable federal, state, or local statutes, ordinances, or regulations including those administered under Shoreline Management Act of 1971."
