PROVISIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that this application be approved for 0.06 cubic feet per second; 6 acre-feet per year from May 1 to October 1 for the irrigation of 3 acres.

As per telephone conversation with the applicant, domestic supply is deleted from this application.

The Water Resources Act of 1971 specifies certain criteria regarding utilization and management of the waters of the State in the best public interest. Favorable consideration of this application has been based on sufficient waters available, at least during portions of the year. However, it is pointed out to the applicant that his use of the water may be subject to regulation at certain times, based on the necessity to maintain water quantities sufficient for preservation of the natural environment.

In accordance with Section 90.03.290 RCW, I find that there is water available for appropriation from the source in question and that the diversion as recommended above will not impair existing rights or be detrimental to the public welfare. Therefore, permit should issue, subject to existing rights and indicated provisions.
