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PROVISIONS

"All diversion shall cease when the flow at the outlet of Long Lake falls at or below 1.5 cubic feet per second."

Water users should understand that quantities recommended and the number of acres to be irrigated may be reduced at the time of issuance of a final water right commensurate with the capacity of the installed system and the number of acres actually irrigated.

Diversion intake shall be tightly screened at all times with wire mesh having openings with dimensions not greater than 0.125 (1/8) inch.

The Water Resources Act of 1971 specifies certain criteria regarding utilization and management of the waters of the State in the best public interest. Issuance of this permit was based on sufficient waters available, at least during portions of the year. However, it is pointed out to the permittee that his use of the water may be subject to regulation at certain times, based on the necessity to maintain water quantities sufficient for preservation of the natural environment.

This permit shall be subject to cancellation should the permittee fail to comply with the above development schedule and/or fail to give notice to the Department of Ecology on forms provided by that Department documenting such compliance.
