

REPORT OF EXAMINATION

Application to Amend Surface Water Permit No. 11953

Cecil L. Dawley

On December 10, 1963, Cecil L. Dawley of Sequim, Washington, filed application to change the period of time in which water may be diverted as well as to amend the purpose of use under the above-numbered permit.

The permit presently authorizes diversion of 0.41 c.f.g. from Dean Creek, tributary of Sequim Bay, for irrigation purposes from April 15 to October 1, and continuously for domestic supply. Mr. Dawley now wishes to divert continuously the same amount of water for community domestic supply, fire protection and irrigation purposes, a part of said irrigation water to be diverted from January 1 to April 15 for storage in an off-stream reservoir and part to be diverted directly from the stream during the irrigation season.

A field examination of the application for amended permit was made by the writer on March 18, 1964. At this time Mr. Dawley was contacted at his home and information was obtained relative to the desired change.

The permittee intends to construct a small pond in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 11 which will be supplied by gravity pipeline from the original point of diversion on Dean Creek, said pond storage diversion to be made only during the period of January 1 to April 1. The pond will be less than 10 feet deep and will contain less than 10 acre-feet, and a reservoir permit will not be required.

The permittee plans to supply up to 10 houses and 10 to 20 trailer units from the stream, these to be located in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 11 and on additional property in Section 2, legal descriptions of which were obtained at the time of examination.

As the proposed changes appear to be in no way detrimental to existing rights and to the public interest, the writer recommends that favorable action be taken on Mr. Dawley's application to amend the permit. As the changed purpose of use,

to community domestic supply, will require a larger permit fee of \$20.00, the permit charge will be made upon receipt of \$12.00, the difference above the initial \$8.00 permit fee paid October 21, 1960. Also, in order to make the change appurtenant to the additional described lands, the permittee is requested to mail his original permit along with the additional fee. The permit will then be returned with the additional properties described.

It is further recommended that, prior to issuance of final certificate of water right, a field examination be made to determine the number and location of hoses and/or trailer units supplied, and the location and number of acres irrigated under the permit.

Special remarks and provisions: The water requirement of this land is calculated on each acre needing 0.01 c.f.g. & 2 acre-feet per year, or a total of 0.40 c.f.g. & 80 acre-feet annually for 40 acres.

In accordance with section 90.20.060 RCW, I find that there is water available for appropriation from the source in question and that the diversion proposed in the application will not impair existing rights or be detrimental to the public welfare. Therefore, permit should issue as recommended above subject to existing rights and indicated provisions.
