1 ANNOUNCEMENT AND SPECIAL INFORMATION

1.1 PUBLIC DISCLOSURE

Bid information, including price sheets, will not be available for public disclosure until after award of the contract. At the time of bid opening, only the name of the bidder and time of bid receipt will be read aloud.

1.2 SCOPE

1.2.1 The Office of State Procurement, Purchasing and Contract Administration (the State) pursuant to RCW Chapter 43.19 as authorized agent for State of Washington, herewith solicits bids for: Discount air travel between city pairs as defined and identified herein. This contract shall be used by State Agencies, Political Subdivisions, and Higher Education to obtain contract fares for flights required by persons in the course of traveling on official state business. "Traveling on official state business" shall include all travel paid for by the state of Washington via an eligible mode of payment as identified herein. Currently the only approved mode of payment is the State of Washington JP Morgan Chase VISA card.

A. Estimated Usage: \$ 12,000,000.00.

B. Purchasers: All State Agencies, Institutions, Community Colleges, The College, and Universities will purchase from this contract whenever the contracted carrier(s) serves the contracted destination within time constraints required by agency program requirements, unless a lower published fare offered to the general public is available from the contractor or an alternate carrier. When the contract carrier(s) for a particular city-pair offers a comparable fare and has seats available at that fare, the contracted carriers are utilized as per the Washington State Office of Financial Management (OFM) Travel Regulations in lieu of a non-contract carrier.

With mutual agreement of the Contractor, the state reserves the right to add or delete eligible purchasers as deemed in the state's best interest.

Political Subdivisions: Participation in this contract may significantly increase the purchase volume. While participation shall be at the option of each political subdivision, the state actively encourages them to purchase from state contracts. All orders from such eligible purchasers are subject to the same contract terms, conditions, mode of payment and pricing as state agencies. The state accepts no responsibility for payment by such purchasers.

Political subdivisions may utilize this contract if:

- Contract is available to those purchasers by mutual agreement of OSP and contractor.

3.3 SPECIFICATIONS

3.3.1 ELIGIBLE BIDDERS

- A. Certification: To receive consideration, bidder must be a Certified Air Carrier or Commuter Air Carrier fully recognized by the United States Department of Transportation and/or other regulatory agencies.
- B. City – Pair Eligibility: For a bid on any given city-pair to be considered responsive, the airline must have received United State Department of Transportation certification to provide such scheduled service between the cities designated and shall have tickets for such services available and for sale by the actual date and time of bid opening. Carriers utilizing aircraft with 30 or more passenger seats will receive preference in market(s) bid. However, the State reserves the right to consider bids from carriers utilizing aircraft with less seating capacity in those markets where such an award is determined to be more economical and in the state’s best interest.
- C. Minimum Service Requirements:
 - Contract passengers must be provided all services and considerations that are provided to the public in the same class of service.
 - Reservation and Ticket Sales: Reservations and tickets must be available to the State from the contract airline, and through all travel agencies appointed by the Contractor and utilized by the State and airlines having ticket agreements with the Contractor. Reservations for contract passengers must be confirmed on the same basis that reservations are confirmed for the public. There shall be no consideration in favor of passengers paying higher fees in the same class of service.
 - Flight Frequency: The acceptable minimum number of flights Monday-Friday, is one flight in each direction between the hours of 6:00 A.M and 11:00 P.M.

 - Schedule Changes: Providing that contracted carrier’s schedule changes affects the general public as well as this contract, the Contractor maintains the right, at its sole discretion, to change, increase, decrease or terminate service to any destination awarded. The State Procurement Officer shall be given 30-day advance written notification of changes whenever said changes would result in an overall schedule that falls below the minimum service level as defined herein.
 - In the event that a contract carrier decreases service to a contracted city-pair below the minimum service level, as defined above, the state reserves the right to re-award that city-pair to the next lowest responsible bidder.
 - Pricing:
 1. Submission: Fares bid shall be submitted in formats specified herein
 2. Automatic Fare Adjustments Clause: Fares will be firm and fixed for the initial six (6) months of the contract term.

Thereafter, contract fares will be subject to adjustment in accordance with the procedures and criteria set forth below.

Increases or decreases (not to exceed 10% in either direction) shall be made automatically by the Office of State Procurement in accordance with the Consumer Price Index for all urban consumer (CPI-U), the Transportation Services Index which is published monthly by the US Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. Adjustments in fares will be based on the percentage changes in the CPI-U Transportation Services Index, and will be effective on October 1, 2004 for tickets purchased on or after March 1, 2004, for the remainder of the contract term. Fare adjustments will be calculated in accordance with the following methodology:

Net Monthly Change

$$\frac{\text{Unadjusted Index}}{\text{Base Index}} = \text{Percentage Change}$$

The data used to calculate adjustments effective October 1, 2004 shall be extracted from monthly Airline Fare Indexes from January 1, 2004 through August, 2004. Adjustments will be applied to all contracted fares thereby precluding any change in relative position of individual Contractors. Contractors shall receive written notification of the nature and amount of fare adjustment 30 days prior to effective date thereof. Contractors shall make available fare adjustments to applicable reservation systems 14 days prior to the effective date of adjustments indicated above, via the Airline Tariff Publishing Company. If the Contractor's normal mode of distribution is other than an electronic reservations system, the Contractor shall ensure that all adjusted fares are disseminated within 14 days in accordance with the Contractor's normal means of providing fare information throughout its distribution and reservation system.

- 3. Fare Adjustments: Should the State and the Contractor mutually agree to extend this contract, fare adjustments, if required, will be negotiated 30-60 days prior to published contract expiration date and in conjunction with contract extension. Automatic fare adjustments as detailed above shall apply to all subsequent extensions.

Fare increase requests will also be honored on a pass-through basis (if properly justified and submitted in writing) at any time during the contract period if said increase is based upon substantiated costs imposed on the airline by governmental regulation, e.g., excise taxes, etc.

- 4. Fare Availability: Within 7 days after issuance of notification of award, contract pricing shall be made available to Contractor's authorized travel agents via a computerized reservation system. If the Contractor's normal mode of distribution is other than an electronic reservations system, the Contractor shall ensure that all fares awarded are disseminated within seven 7 days in accordance with the Contractor's normal means of providing fare information throughout its distribution and reservation system. All Contractors are required to use the Fare Basis Code: YCAWA for unrestricted fares awarded for the named carrier.

is requested that airport codes be used in conjunction with YCAWA contract fare designators in multiple airport markets. For example, in the SEA/DCA market, a 10-letter code should be used, YCAWADCA to indicate that the contract fare only applies between Seattle and Washington National Airport. The YCAWA or shall not be used for any city-pair not awarded to said carrier.

5. Fare Applicability: Bidder's pricing for all domestic routes must include all applicable federal, state, and local taxes and surcharges customarily included in the fare structure displayed in the Computerized Reservation System. Pricing for international routes shall be the base fare (i.e. the price the air carrier charges for service) exclusive of taxes and fees. In addition, pricing must also include costs of meals (when free meals are available to coach class passengers), normal baggage conveyance (including standard free baggage allowance), advance reservations, all normal customer service functions, cost of bid preparation, and all contractual requirements specified herein. Passenger Facility Charges (PFC) and segment fees shall not be included in fares bid. However, the State acknowledges that the PFC and segment fees will be charged as authorized at the time of ticketing.

All fares awarded herein shall be available on all tickets purchased during the contract period, including those purchased during the last month of the contract period for travel completed during the following month. Any fare placed under contract will apply seven days per week to all coach class seats on scheduled flights of that contract carrier in the market bid. That fare shall be the highest fare which the carrier can charge the State for coach class transportation in that market. Lower coach fares offered to the general public by the contract carrier shall also be available to the State, provided the fare requirements meets all the terms and conditions of the state contract fare. Contractor shall arrange for prompt adjustment on all charges exceeding contract price.

6. Fare Discrimination: Contract fares must be applicable for all available seats on a given flight in the coach class section. Contractor shall not discriminate against any State business traveler in favor of higher fare tickets paid by other travelers on any given seat or block(s) of seats in the same class of service.

F. Service Information

1. Submission: Service Information will be submitted in formats specified herein:
 - a. Bidder shall not enter flights that are below minimum service requirements.
For example, bidder will not enter any flights originating outside the 6:00 A.M. to 11:00 P.M. flight departure parameters, nor any connecting flights within those parameters with more than two (2) hour cumulative layover time (domestic city-pairs) or two and one half (2 ½) hour cumulative layover time (international city-pairs).
 - b. Bidder shall submit service information based upon their daily (Monday – Friday) service scheduled for the week of March 1, 2004 through March 31, 2005.
 - c. Bidder shall submit on price sheets a schedule of its flights, in each direction, for each city-pair bid. The schedule shall display the following information:

- d. If a bidder believes that no carrier meets the minimum requirements for a specific market, they may submit a bid below the minimum requirements for that market. Offers shall specifically identify such markets and include a letter with their offer,
- e. Identifying those markets in which they bid despite having service below the minimum.

3.3.2 RESPONSIBILITIES OF STATE AGENCIES:

A. Use Guidelines:

State agencies shall utilize the air travel services as provided by carrier awarded contract(s) except under the following conditions:

The agency departmental director or designee determines that:

- 1. Contractor does not travel to the desired destination(s) and/or does not do so within the time constraints required by agency program requirements; or
- 2. When transportation is offered to the public at a published fare, which is less than the State contract fare. Note: When the contract carrier(s) for a particular city-pair offers a comparable fare and has seats available at that fare, the contracted carrier shall be utilized in lieu of a non-contract carrier.

B. Identification Requirements:

Any of the following documentation will be acceptable as verification that travel is being conducted for the purpose of official business on behalf of the State of Washington:

- 1. Authorizing letter, on agency letterhead stating that traveler is conducting official State business. This letter should include traveler's name, dates of travel, traveler's basic itinerary, and authorizing signature.
- 2. State travel charge card.

C. Method of Payment:

Payment for purchases under this contract made only through the state credit/charge card program, currently JP Morgan Chase-Visa.

D. Dual Awards:

It is the intent of the state not to make dual awards.

5 CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS

5.1 RETENTION OF RECORDS

The contractor shall maintain, for at least three years after completion of this contract, all relevant records pertaining to this contract. This shall include, but not be limited to, all records pertaining to actual contract performance from the date of contract award. It shall also include information necessary to document the level of utilization of MWBE’s and other businesses as

subcontractors : suppliers in this contract as well ; ny efforts the contractor makes to increase the participation of MWBE's. The contractor shall also maintain, for at least three years after completion of this contract, a record of all quotes, bids, estimates, or proposals submitted to the Contractor by all businesses seeking to participate as subcontractors or suppliers in this contract. The State shall have the right to inspect and copy such records. If this contract involves federal funds, Contractor shall comply with all record keeping requirements set forth in any federal rules, regulations, or statutes included or referenced in the contract documents.

6 SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

6.1 PRICING AND ADJUSTMENTS

Unless otherwise stipulated all bids must include unit prices and extensions where applicable and be otherwise in the format requested.

See Paragraph 3.3 Specifications for details related to Pricing and Adjustment.

6.1.1 All pricing shall include the costs of bid preparation, servicing of accounts, and all contractual requirements.

6.1.2 During the term of this contract, should the contractor enter into pricing agreements with other customers providing greater benefits or lower pricing, contractor shall immediately amend the state contract to provide similar pricing to the state if the contract with other customers offers similar usage quantities, and similar conditions impacting pricing. Contractor shall immediately notify the state of any such contracts entered into by contractor.

6.2 CONTRACTOR PERFORMANCE

6.2.1 General Requirements: The state, in conjunction with purchasers, monitors and maintains records of Contractor performance. Said performance shall be a factor in evaluation and award of this and all future contracts. Purchasers will be provided with product/service performance report forms to forward reports of superior or poor performance to the State Procurement Officer.

6.3 TRAVEL CARD ACCEPTANCE

The current card available for state agency use is a VISA product. Bookings can only be made with the state contracted charge card. The state uses cards and Corporate Travel Accounts also know as ghost accounts. The contractor will allow bookings via a CTA.

6.4 BIDDER COMPLIANCE

The State reserves the right to consider the actual level of bidder's compliance with the requirements specified in this IFB, and to consider a bid responsive if it substantially complies with the state's intent relative to overall bid requirements and specifications.

6.5 BID ON CD

In addition to a hard copy originally signed in ink bid submittal, the bidder shall submit their bid on a CD in Micro Soft Word format (except the price sheets). The price sheets shall be on a separate CD with the price sheets in Micro Soft Excel.
