

Decoding the Financial Statement ZIP File Naming Convention

The file naming convention and terminology are designed by the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC). While the OIC web site provides some identifying information about ZIP filings, this document is designed to help users decode the file names on their own.

- 1) The file name can vary in length but will have a suffix extension of **".ZIP"**.
- 2) The file name to the left of the **".ZIP"** extension consists of the following fields, which are delimited by an underscore ("**_**") character. The letters are not case-sensitive.
- 3) The general form of the file name is **ccccc_vc_s_yyyy_f_d_vv_sa_ss_zz_p.ZIP**

Field	Meaning	Field Number (shown solely to help decode)
ccccc	Company code (a unique five-digit number assigned by the NAIC).	1
vc	Vendor code. Identifies which vendor created the software for preparing the files. The code number is assigned by the NAIC, but it is not important for viewing purposes.	2
s	Statement code. This identifies the type of financial statement, which may be different from the business type of the company. For example, the health statement may be used by certain property and casualty or life insurers.	3

yyyy	Year of the data. For example, the December 31, 2007 Annual Statement, supplements and audited financial statements are filed during 2008, but contain 2007 data.	4

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vv	Version number. These are set by the company and may not be sequential.	7	
sa	Separate Account ID. Zero unless the Submission Group type code is "S". Used to distinguish between a company's different separate account filings, if applicable.	8	
ss	State Supplement Code. Has more significance with the PDF file names.	9	
zz	ZIP file sequence number. Set by the company and may not be sequential.	10	
p	The public disclosure indicator added by the OIC during processing of a company's filing.	11

Examples of how to decode the field information:

63177_10_L_2008_O_1_1_0_NA_1_N.ZIP

1. 63177 = the NAIC company code for Farmers New World Life Insurance Company.
 2. 10 = (not important for viewing purposes.)
 3. L = a Life financial statement.
 4. 2008 = contains data for 2008.
 5. O = an Original filing.
 6. 1 = a first quarter filing (combine with the year to know it's March 31, 2008).
- Fields 7 through 10 are not of significance for this decoding.
11. N = designated as a public document.

65105_10_x_2007_o_m_1_0_na_1_n.zip

1. 65105 = the NAIC company code for LifeWise Health Plan of Arizona.
 2. 10 = (not important for viewing purposes.)
 3. X = a Health financial statement--although a life and disability insurer, the company qualifies to file the health (X) financial statement.
 4. 2007 = contains data for 2007.
 5. O = an Original filing.
 6. M = a March filing (could contain the annual financial statements and/or supplements).
- Fields 7 through 10 are not of significance for this decoding.
11. N = designated as a public document.

50970_13_T_2007_O_J_1_00_NA_01_N.ZIP

1. 50970 = the NAIC company code for Pacific Northwest Title Insurance Company.
 2. 13 = (not important for viewing purposes.)
 3. T = a Title financial statement.
 4. 2007 = contains data for 2007.
 5. O = an Original filing.
 6. J = a June filing (could contain the audited financial statements and/or supplements).
- Fields 7 through 10 are not of significance for this decoding.
11. N = designated as a public document.
